Founded by Billie Jean King in 1973 on the principle of equal opportunity, the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) is the global leader in women's professional sports. The WTA is one of the world's most recognisable and high-profile sports organisations, consisting of more than 1650 players representing approximately 85 nations, all competing to earn WTA rankings points and prestigious tournament titles. The WTA Tour comprises over 50 events and four Grand Slams, spanning six continents and nearly 30 countries and regions with a global audience of over 700 million. The Tour culminates with the WTA Finals, honouring the season's top singles and doubles players based on the final standings of the Race to WTA Finals leaderboard. The Women's Tennis Association requirements

The WTA is looking for experienced remedial massage therapists or myotherapists to work at the upcoming Adelaide Tournament, working alongside the sports medicine team, which includes physiotherapy, medical practitioners, and mental health practitioners.

The WTA requires commitment from the applicant to participate in the 2024 Adelaide Tournament, Saturday 6 January 2024 through and including Thursday, 11 January 2024.

The WTA requires successful applicants to possess the following skills, abilities, experience and qualifications:

Knowledge, skills and abilities:

- » High standard of organisation and administration skills.
- » High standard of written and verbal communication skills.
- » Ability to work well under pressure and long hours.
- » Ability to adapt to changing work conditions and schedule.
- » High standard and knowledge of ethical principles and able to follow direction.

Qualifications and experience:

- » Remedial/Sports Massage qualifications (Diploma or Advanced Diploma or above) at least three years of sports experience
- » Experience providing massage therapy support at a sporting event an advantage
- » Knowledge of tennis an advantage.

Other requirements/considerations:

- » The on-call hours each day are one hour before the first match begins, typically from 11am until one hour after the last match concludes, this could be as late as 11pm. Rain delays alter the schedule.
- » The therapists must stay onsite for the scheduled days.
- » WTA requires therapists complete a WTA credential, which includes a background check, they must complete a Safeguarding course to attain the credentials.
- » Therapists must complete a Professional Expectations and Orientation course.
- » Therapists are required to bring their own portable massage table, laptop, mobile phone, with WhatsApp, which is the preferred method of communication.
- » The position is paid, a daily fee of US\$280.00 can be claimed by the successful applicant at the completion of the tournament schedule.

What will Massage & Myotherapy Australia provide:

- » The Association will offer financial support for travel and accommodation costs, with a maximum limit of \$2,000.
- » Payment will be processed upon submission of an expense claim, along with receipts that clearly indicate a payment has been made.
- » Meals will be provided by WTA (Breakfast or any other meals/snacks or transfer expenses are not included).

- » **Complete the application form or Include in your application a document that addresses each criterion in order.**
- » **A current CV (curriculum vitae).**

The application process is very short due to time constraints, we encourage anyone interested to apply early to avoid disappointment.

If you have previously applied or won other Massage & Myotherapy Australia National Sporting Organisation Scholarship(s) in the past, you are still eligible to apply.

The closing date of the Scholarship is Wednesday 22 November 2023 at 5pm AEDT.
